Synopsis of Technical Papers

PAPER I: "AMATEUR RADIO SATCOM" BY COLIN RICHARDS 9M2CR

Radio Amateurs have a long history of exploring new fields of endeavour in radio technology. In the early days of radio, short waves were ignored by the world's radio authorities as being useless for practical purposes. It was left to radio amateurs to show that short waves in fact had immense possibilities and could readily be used for world-wide communication.

It is not surprising therefore to find that radio amateurs were actively experimenting with satellite communication even before the first commercial satellite, Telstar 1, came into service in 1962. This paper describes the broad development of amateur radio satellite communications from the first OSCAR 1 in 1961 to the latest OSCAR 13 now orbitting the globe in a giant ellipse.

PAPER II: "THE NEW ZEALAND NATIONAL LINK" BY PETER WILLIAMS, ZL2ARW

This paper describes the amateur radio link which is currently being implemented in New Zealand. The project began approximately 5 years ago with the aim of providing a network of linked UHF repeaters throughout NZ. So far, over 80% of the amateur population is covered, and work is continuing to increase this. The Link backbone is being upgraded from a single NBFM voice channel in the 70 cm band to a multi-channel digital link in the 23 cm band.

The Link is used for many purposes including monthly official broadcast from NZART, packet bulletin distribution and emergency communications. The paper will include details of the UHF and microwave equipment being used, descriptions of the sites and paths in use and future plans for the link.

PAPER III: "VHF PROPAGATION IN THE TROPICS" BY DAN NELSON, 9V1SS

The many and varied factors affecting the propagation of VHF radio signals are discussed. Particular emphasis is given to those areas in which atmospheric conditions unique to tropical areas play an important role in influencing VHF communications. Topics to be covered include:

- · calculation of free space path loss
- antenna height and its relationship to horizon distance
- changes in apparent horizon distance with varying atmospheric conditions
- · wave interference and the Fresnel effect
- antenna polarization
- ducting of signals through temperature inversion layers
- tropospheric scatter propagation

PROGRAMME: The main purpose of the convention is to give SEANET participants a chance for eyeball QSOs.

SEANET 89 will begin on Friday evening with a cocktail reception.

On Saturday the programme includes a demo of "Teleview", an electronic interactive information system, and a visit to the Information Technology Exhibition.

Delegates will attend a show at the "Omnimax" theatre and then rendezvous to the 9VISC amateur radio station, located at the Singapore Science Centre.

The grand banquet on Saturday night will include a sing along session.

There will be presentation of Technical papers on Sunday.

SARTS will operate an amateur radio station at the Convention Hotel, Century Park Sheraton, with the call-sign 9V0SEA. Propagation tests on 50 MHz will be carried out from the Convention station.

Hotels reservation for either Century Park Sheraton or Ming Court must be made in advance, on or before 15 Sept 89. The hotel occupancy rate in Singapore is very high and November 89 is expected to be a popular season for tourists and Corporate business travellers. Hence hotels are not willing to hold rooms indefinitely for Seanet delegates. The hotels have requested all room reservations to be supported with a deposit of one days room rate.

In the event of cancellation, deposits on hotel room reservations and the registration fee for the Convention will be refunded if notice of cancellation is received by 30 October 89.

Arriving in Singapore: The cost of taxi fare from Changi Airport to the convention hotel is approximately SING \$18.00.

Most Taxi drivers are fluent in English.

VISAS: Entry visas are not required for citizens of most countries for a social visit of two weeks. Besides their valid passports or travel documents, visitors must be in possession of an onward or return ticket and sufficient funds. If in doubt please check with the nearest Singapore Overseas mission or travel agent for the latest visa requirement.

IMPORTATION OF COMMUNICATION EQUIPMENT:

Prior authorisation from the Singapore Telecoms is necessary for importation of radio transmitters.
